As the name suggests this self learning module consists of a series of Easy Activities in four categories as follows.

All these activities are constructed by an experienced group of resource persons, who engage in text book writing as well as G.C.E.(O/L) paper marking.

The activities are similar to the tasks in the G.C.E. (O/L) English Language paper aiming at providing practice avenues for students to score more marks in paper one. We expect that these activities will meet the requirements of the average level student or the student who is just below the pass mark, and will be useful as a supplementary material for the teachers as well.

Further, we have included a fewer number of activities to make it a less heavy task for the student to ensure his / her attempt in all the activities before the exam. Therefore, it is expected to have many copies of this book available in schools to address the needs of many students as much as possible.

The users of this Self Learning Kit are instructed to, read carefully the instructions of each activity first and then attempt the task. The number of blanks to be filled / number of questions to be answered / number of corrections to be done etc. will give you a hint of the time you have to spend on each activity and the approximate marks for each.

The activities go from simple to complex and the answer key will guide self correcting which again strengthen one's learning habits.

At the initial stage, we find it impossible to furnish each student with a copy and the teachers are kindly requested to find means of copying the activities at school level.






