## 7. Plurals of Nouns

Naming words are called 'nouns'. Here are some nouns. Can you read them?
Examples:

Penpencil school television chair book boy teacher girl tree fan dog cat cow bicycle table

Let's learn how to say if we have more than one.


We add ' $s$ ' to most singular nouns to make them plural nouns.
Examples:

| Singular (one) | Plural (more than one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| cat | cats |
| book | books |
| school | school $\underline{s}$ |

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We add 'es' to singular nouns to make them plural nouns. Look at their endings. They are s, sh, ch, ss or x .

Examples:

| Singular <br> (one) | Plural (more than <br> one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| bus | buses |
| box | boxes |
| Watch | watches |



We add 'es' to singular nouns ends with ' $o$ ' to make them plural nouns.

Example:

| Singular <br> (one) | Plural (more than one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| mango | mangoes |
| tomato | tomatoes |
| hero | heroes |
| Exceptions: | radios |
| radio | studios |
| studio |  |

When the last letter of a singular noun is ' y ' and the letter before ' y ' is a consonant, its plural is formed by changing ' y ' to ' ies'.

Examples:

| Singular (one) | Plural (more than one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| baby | babies |
| fly | flies |
| city | cities |

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Some nouns ending with ' f ' or ' fe ' form their plural by adding ' ves '.

Examples: ves

| Singular (one) | Plural (more than <br> one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| leaf | Leaves |
| knife | Knives |
| calf | Calves |

Some nouns have different singular and plural forms.
Examples:

| Singular (one) | Plural (more than <br> one) |
| :--- | :--- |
| man | men |
| child | children |
| woman | women |
