

**Name of activity:** Word of the Day

**Short description:** Students practice pronunciation and meaning of lexis related to extracurricular activities through dramatization.

**Link to curriculum:** Grade 7; Unit 1.14

**Difficulty level:** Medium

**Time:** 40 mins

**Learning outcomes:** by the end of this activity: Students will be able to learn the meaning and practice pronunciation of some words related to extracurricular activities.

## Option 1: Worksheet

<b>Preparation</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Prepare (or select from the list given below) 10-12 words related to extracurricular activities. Choose ones relevant for your students.</li> <li>2. Write them up on (5cm x 6cm) individual pieces of paper.</li> <li>3. The number of words should match the number of groups in your class. (3 students per group)</li> </ol>
<b>Stage / Time</b>	<b>Procedure</b>
<b>Introduction</b>  <b>5 mins</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Arrange students in small groups. (3 students per group)</li> <li>2. Tell students that they are going to do some acting in class that day.</li> <li>3. Tell them that each group will be given a word and that they have to act it out to show the meaning and practice the pronunciation of the word.</li> <li>4. Tell students that the word presented best will be the word of the day.</li> <li>5. Tell students that you will show them an example.             Model the word <i>'play ground'</i> 3 times.             Pretend to play basket ball. Then look at students and say:   <i>"A <b>playground</b> is a place for children to play and have fun."            "This is our school <b>playground</b>."</i>             Then go back to playing the game for a few seconds.</li> <li>6. Ask students what you did:   <i>Did I model/repeat the word clearly? – yes.</i>   <i>How many times? – 3 times.</i>   <i>Did I say it fast?- No.</i>   <i>Did I act out the word to bring out meaning? – Yes.</i>   <i>Did I use the word meaningfully in a sentence? -Yes.</i> </li> </ol>
<b>Preparation</b>  <b>5-7 mins</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Now give groups their word and ask them to do the same.</li> <li>2. Tell that all students must take part in the activity.</li> <li>3. Tell students that they have 5 minutes to prepare.</li> <li>4. Monitor and assist groups with pronunciation etc. Check all</li> </ol>

	groups before they come up to present their word.
<b>Presenting</b> <b>30 mins</b>	1. Ask students to vote for the best presentation (individually) by writing the word that group presented on a piece of paper. The teacher can also join by voting.
<b>Feedback</b> <b>3 mins</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Ask 2 students to help you select the best group.</li> <li>2. Praise the winners and announce the selected word as the <b>word of the day</b>.</li> <li>3. Write it on top of the black/white board with a sentence used to introduce the word.</li> </ol>
<b>Variations</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. You can note down any common errors in language/ pronunciation to highlight when giving feedback.</li> <li>2. You can give new words or ask groups to select their own word on a previous date and assign 1 group each to present a word at the start/ end of each class.</li> <li>3. If time permits, get students to mingle and model and drill their word with other students and later write the new words with the sentence used to bring out their meaning.</li> </ol>
