

After lunch, Mahinda said to his nephew, I suppose you'd like to get on with looking round the farm now, so that you can give me your expert advice about what we are doing wrong."

Hesith blushed and protested that he would probably not be able to find anything wrong at all, but Mahinda could see that he was saying this only out of politeness, and that he really thought himself an expert on farming. He asked him to change his shoes before going out, so as not to make his carpets dirty when they came in again. Then as **they** went out of the house to start their tour, Mahinda said, "I suppose you know that we grow a variety of vegetables on this farm. We sell **them** to the markets at Dambulla and so on.
