Option 1: Worksheet

Preparation	 Prepare (or select from the list given below) 10-12 words related to reading. 	
	2. Write them up on (5cm x 6cm) individual pieces of paper.	
	 The number of words should match the number of groups in your class. (3 students per group) 	
	4. Take any suitable story book to class for the demo.	
Stage / Time	Procedure	
Introduction	1. Arrange students in small groups. (3 students per group)	
5 mins	Tell students that they are going to do some acting in class that day.	
	 Tell them that each group will be given a word and that they have to act it out to show the meaning and practice the pronunciation of the word. 	
	 Tell students that the word presented best will be the word of the day. 	
	5. Tell students that you will show them an example.	
	Model the word 'reading' 3 times.	
	Take your story book and pretend to read for a few seconds. Then look at students and say	
	"I love reading. I'm reading a story book these days."	
	Then go back to your seat and pretend to read again for a few seconds.	
	6. Ask students what you did:	
	Did I model/repeat the word clearly? – yes.	
	Did I say it fast?- No.	
	Did I act out the word to bring out meaning? – Yes.	
	Did I use the word meaningfully in a sentence? -Yes.	
Preparation	1. Now give groups their word and ask them to do the same.	
5-7 mins	2. Tell that all students must take part in the activity.	
	3. Tell students that they have 5 minutes to prepare.	
	4. Monitor and assist groups with pronunciation etc. Check all	

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	groups before they come up to present their word.
Presenting	1. Ask students to vote for the best presentation (individually) by
	writing the word that group presented on a piece of paper. The
30 mins	teacher can also join by voting.
Feedback	1. Ask 2 students to help you select the best group.
3 mins	 Praise the winners and announce the selected word as the word of the day.
	Write it on top of the black/white board with a sentence used to introduce the word.
Variations	1. You can note down any common errors in language/
	pronunciation to highlight when giving feedback.
	2. You can give new words or ask groups to select their own word on
	a previous date and assign 1 group each to present a word at the start/ end of each class.
	3. If time permits, get students to mingle and model and drill their
	word with other students and later write the new words with the sentence used to bring out their meaning.
