Option 1: Worksheet

Preparation	 Pre- teach the language and structure of making suggestions provided in the text book

	 Have several sets of cut ups of phrases of suggestions (1st part and 2nd part separately and preferably in two colours)
Stage / Time	Procedure
Introduction 5 mins	Give students a context of an idea of going to see a movie together.
	2. Ask them how they are going to suggest that idea to the others
	e.g. Shall we, do you think, let's
	3. Ask what sorts of responses they can expect
	e.g. Sure, That's great, ok, of course
Language activity	Divide class into groups of 4 -5 students and distribute cut up sets per group
10 mins	Students arrange the expressions of making suggestions with the matching verb form.
	Tell students that several expressions can match with one verb form
	4. Have a whole class feedback session discussion on the formal and informal types of suggestions e.g. Let's?, shall we? (informal) Would you like?, How about? (formal)
	5. Ask students to take records in their books



Instructions for onion rings

- 1. Students stand in two circles facing each other (inner circle face outwards, and inner circle face inwards). Every student should be facing a partner (so same number of students in inner and outer circles).
- 2. If the number of students is high, you can have 2 or three groups (But the numbers in both circles have to match)
- 3. The students in the middle makes suggestions to the students in the outer circle, and the students in the outer circle respond.
- 4. Students in the inner circle move one place to their left and make a suggestion to the next students in the outer circle
- 5. This continues until students in the inner circle have made suggestions to all in the outer circle.
