An importer of Persian carpets he travels a great deal and so was not around much to spot the truth. While he's away, Brenda copes with any situation by explaining that she can't do anything until she's discussed it with her husband.

Brenda has been very successful in her job. For the last five years she has worked as a waitress at and exclusive private club, and was promoted to head waitress. She kept the thing a secret there too, and got over the practical difficulties somehow.
