

Future Through Comics





Future Continuous Tense

The future continuous tense is formed with will be + the present participle (verb+ing).

We use the Future Continuous to say that an action will be in progress at a particular time in the future.

e.g. :- 1. A : What **will** you **be doing** at this time tomorrow?

B: I will be doing my homework.
