

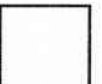

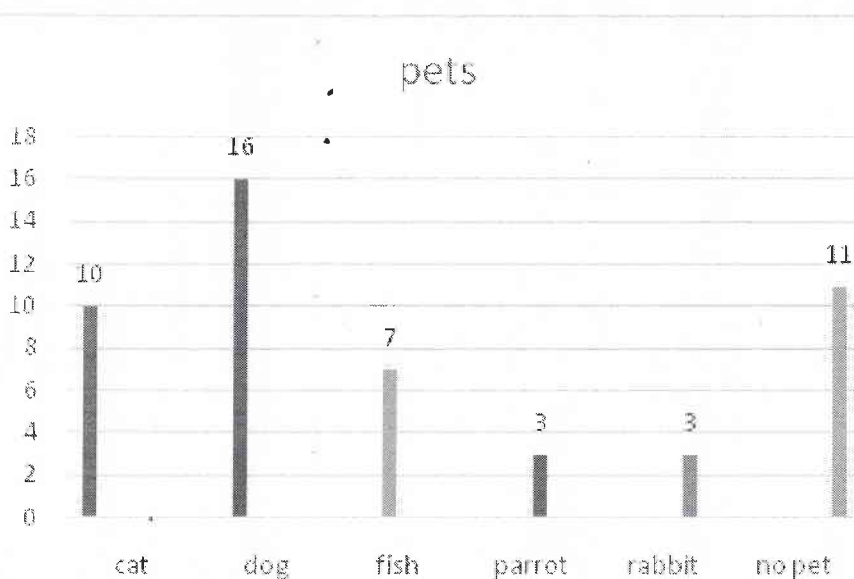

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### Test 15

**Read the following text and answer the question given below it.**

1) Sunlight appears colourless but really it is made up of different colours. Sometimes you can see these colours- on the surfaces of bubbles or if there is oil on water. You may also see colours across the sky in the form of a rainbow. In each case, “white” light is being separated into colours called the spectrum.

2) When the sun comes out during a shower you may see a rainbow. The sunlight shines on the droplets of rain and gets separated into the colours of the spectrum.

From a distance the light appears as a coloured arc across the sky. People divide

the rainbow into seven bands of colour- red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. The colours always appear in the same order with red on the outside and violet on the inside of the arc.

3) Sometimes a dazzling displays of coloured lights appear in the sky at nights in parts of the world which are far away from the equator. These lights are caused by huge explosions on the surface of the sun known as “flares”. During a flare, millions of tiny particles are sent out from the sun. They travel very fast and some eventually reach the Earth’s atmosphere. The Earth’s magnetism bends the paths of the particles so they only reach the Earth’s atmosphere near the poles. As they travel through the air they bump into other particles. These collisions produce light. In the North they can be seen best in parts of Canada but they can also be seen in northern Scotland and Scandinavia. They are called the Northern Lights or “Aurora borealis”. similar lights can be seen in the South where they are called “Aurora australis”.
